For this measure subjects are asked questions designed to assess their preference for daily activities, such as brushing their teeth, eating, sweeping, kicking and throwing (i.e. left or right hand/foot or both). At the conclusion of the measure the examinee is also asked to center a dot with their thumb with alternating eyes being closed. Number values are assigned to each answer choice making it easier to code the preference for right hand versus the left.
