

## **Family Informant Schedule and Criteria (FISC)**

The Family Informant Schedule and Criteria is a semi-structured interview used to assess psychiatric history in probands' biological parents and second degree relatives. This measure allows for probable/definite diagnostic decisions by covering all major DSM-III-R Axis I diagnoses and were later re-assessed with DSM-IV criterion. Subjects were asked to provide FISCs on both of their parents.
