

Social Adjustment Scale Self-Report (SAS-SR)

This is a 54-item self-report measure used to assess social functioning in adults across a wide variety of common areas (work, leisure, extended family, primary relationships, parental and family unit). It dually gauges one's feelings of satisfaction, performance and perception, as well as any conflict experienced in these various roles, as applicable. This tool is widely used in both research and clinical practice.
