

## **Social Responsiveness Scale (SRS)**

This 65-item rating scale assesses autistic symptoms ranging in severity in the general population. It is usually completed by a parent or teacher. Each item inquires about an observed aspect of reciprocal social behavior, such as social awareness, social information processing, capacity for reciprocal social responses, social anxiety or avoidance, and autistic preoccupations. Scores are normally distributed in the general population, and they are strongly heritable across generations.
